

## **Hollow Hill Farm**

Hollow Hill Farm, site of Mansion in May 1981, was built in the early 1900's by Mr. and Mrs. Paul Moore, who had been living on Madison Avenue in Morristown, on the site of what is now Morristown Memorial



Hospital. Facing on Canfield Road, Hollow Hill Farm is approached by two long driveways that lead to a circular drive and courtyard and then continue to wind around the 52-acre estate. The back of the house looks out over a gently sloping hill which descends to Woodland Avenue. It was discovered during construction that the hill had a sandpit in its center; thus the name "Hollow Hill Farm". This was a working farm – butter and cheese from the dairy, Guernseys in the fields, a chicken yard, goats, pigs, pheasants, ducks – and a vegetable garden and fruit trees. The main house is constructed of red brick with a massive slate roof. All rooms opened to the gardens and grounds, with prize-winning roses leading to a winding path through leafy shrubs and shady trees to a fish pool and bower. The manor house and property of Hollow Hill Farm are now the Moore Estate, a community of privately-owned residences.
